

As with a number of other models, the instructions from Chunghop do not include a code set so the most likely match has been added. However, having subsequently acquired one of these devices (well actually two, but we'll not go there) I found it to use 4 rather than the original 3 digit codes. Consequently, the RM-101 is one of only two models (the other being the RM-969E) that has the distinction of featuring in both the 3 and 4 digit code groups.

Concerning the codes.

The choice of 3b-i (3 digit variant) was based on the programming example within the instructions; 3b being the only set following this TV format...

Thomson: 065, 067, 075, 078, 098, 100, 103, 185, 186, 222.

Thorn-Ferguson: 001, 135, 136, 137, 140, 144, 148, 152, 160, 186, 229, 256.

The 4 digit variant uses the same TV codes (including extra manufacturers, and sometimes codes) but with an added prefix 0; i.e. Thompson/Thorn-Ferguson now become...

Thomson: 0065, 0067, 0075, 0078, 0098, 0100, 0103, 0185, 0186, 0222.

Thorn-Ferguson: 0001, 0135, 0136, 0137, 0140, 0144, 0148, 0152, 0160, 0186, 0229, 0256.

However, the remaining codes (VCR, DVD, SAT etc.) appear to be completely different.

As there doesn't appear to be any means by which one can readily identify a 3 or 4 digit type, I thought it wise to include both manuals in the RC file.

Note that if one has a 3 digit version of this model and find that the added codes do not work, (somewhat unlikely, but one can never be certain with Chunghop) there are a number of other 3 digit code sets available from RC, here...
